Drama will be used to explore feelings which will then be written as diary entries.

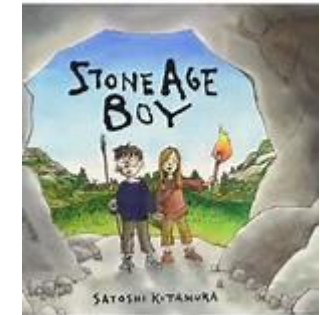
Our home learning will link history and literacy, giving children the chance to research how our ancestors used to live.

## Long Ago in Ancient Time

Butser Ancient Farm is a unique experimental archaeological site situated in the South Downs National Park. The farm displays ongoing constructions of ancient buildings based on real sites, dating from the Stone Age through the Iron Age and Roman Britain, and finishing with the Anglo-Saxons.

Through this visit, the year 3 will have the opportunity to experience how our ancestors used to live and work. They will consider how life has changed. In history, children will explore Stone Age settlements by becoming archaeological detectives and in geography, they will use maps to consider why people settled in particular places in the UK.

## Cross-Curricular learning
